At the time these words are being written, over 5 million people have lost their lives due to COVID-19-related causes and the variant called Omicron closed borders and once again impeded mobility and reencounters from around the world.

Amidst this tragedy, the pandemic also revealed the way in which the world is organized: several so-called *developed* countries used robbery practices to hijack medical supplies, ventilators and biosecurity equipment, hoarded vaccines, and some of them used the health emergency to continue choking with unilateral coercive measures.

However, despite these circumstances, the member countries of the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our America - Peoples' Trade Treaty (ALBA-TCP) were among the countries that best managed the harsh realities imposed by both the sanitary emergency and the illegal and illegitimate imposition of extortive measures. The fact that Cuba has manufactured 5 vaccines against COVID-19 is a source of pride for all the peoples of the South. As Silvio Rodríguez states: "I think that if we have achieved our own vaccination candidates under the cruelest blockade (and I say this without any excessive triumphalism), what would we not be able to achieve if we lived in peace and had the same opportunities like other countries? If Cuba were free of the blockade, it would be the opportunity to be and to fully show ourselves as we are".

In this context and in order to commemorate the seventeenth anniversary of its creation, ALBA-TCP held its 20th Summit of Heads of State and Government on December 14th, 2021, in Havana, Cuba.

This important date is an opportunity to pay tribute to the founding fathers of this Alliance: Commanders Fidel Castro and Hugo Chávez, who at that time sowed the seeds of an alternative not only against the FTAA, but also against capitalism; an Alliance based on the principles of the Bolivarian doctrine and the lessons of José Martí; **an Alliance for life.**

The highest authorities from Cuba, Venezuela, Bolivia, Nicaragua, Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, Grenada, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, St. Kitts and Nevis and Saint Lucia met to analyze the challenges facing the Alliance, the region and the planet. They decided on methods, mechanisms and instruments to deepen coordination efforts in areas such as politics, culture, communications, youth, gender and women's rights, education, health and many other topics.

The Summit also addressed one of the economic activities most affected during the pandemic: tourism; the steps taken to reopen the sector, the consolidation of ALBA multi-destinations and the exchange of experiences at both the academic level and the exchange of biosecurity protocols.

Given the importance of the area, we express our gratitude to the Minister for Tourism, Alí Padrón, and the Vice Minister for International Tourism, Leticia Gómez, both from the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, for having opened the doors of "Viajes Venetur" magazine to allow the countries of our Alliance to disseminate the beauty and tourism potential of each of our destinations. We are sure that we count on your support to continue the sublime battle for the unity of our peoples.

Cuban tourism as a driving force of the economy



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Cuban tourism will continue to be a driving force of our economy to provide the income to contribute to the well-being of our people.

Among the priorities included in the calendar of actions to be completed this year are the implementation of the measures of the social economic strategy for the sector, the monetary policy, and the strengthening of the socialist state business.

Attention is focused on the main outbound visitor markets, increasing the country's foreign exchange income. Another priority is the digital transformation of the sector, with the expansion of Internet use in hotel areas and the extra-hotel network, over 70 percent of which already use broadband; the Wi-Fi deployment is almost complete in 4- and 5-star hotels.

The certification of the facilities with the status "Safer and more hygienic tourism", as part of the measures and protocols for dealing with COVID-19, represents a strength supporting the gradual recovery of the sector, by providing it with better conditions for the quality service






to meet the demands of the "new normality" that should characterize tourism on a planetary scale, while continuing to train the labor force for the tourism industry.

Our programs focus on hotel and extra-hotel products as a complement to a wide range of services. Among them are the Lodging Program, Health and Wellness Tourism Program, Camping Program, Real Estate Development Program for Tourism, Marinas and Nautical Program, Recreation Program, Nature Program and Support Institutions Program for Tourism.

The tourism hotel industry expects an average growth of 4 thousand rooms per year until 2030. These figures include the country's main sun and beach tourist destinations, such as Varadero, Cayos del Norte de Villa Clara, Ciego de Ávila, Camagüey and Holguín, as well as the city tourism mode focused on the development and recovery of the historical, patrimonial and cultural values of the historical centers of Cuba's cities.





Extra-hotel programs play an important role within the diversity of the tourism product, being a perfect complement to the country's housing infrastructure, along with the development of parks and thematic recreational complexes according to the destination in which people are located and other products related to the city and nature.

The health and wellness program relies on the excellence of Cuban medical services and Cuban tourism is proud to have a development strategy in this modality, focusing on the human being and life.

Currently, foreign visitors are interested in a visit beyond the sun and the beach; they come to Cuba eager to know and be part of its history, culture and traditions, to live and enjoy its natural landscapes, and to keep unforgettable memories of this island.

In addition to the security offered by Cuba to its visitors, we have among our greatest attractions a vast cultural and historical legacy, which includes 9 sites declared Cultural Heritage of Humanity, 4 elements of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity, 14 national parks, 277 National Monuments, including some tourist facilities such as the National Hotel of Cuba, the Inglaterra Hotel, the Tropicana Cabaret, among others.

Throughout the year, Cuba holds music, dance, theater and film festivals, among other events that keep the country's artistic and cultural flame alive. These cultural events such as the Jazz Plaza International Festival, the Alicia Alonso Havana International Ballet Festival, the International Festival of New Latin American Cinema, we share them with all visitors.

Today more than ever, tourism requires productive chains to be improved as a system. It is necessary to enhance this chain with a number of areas such as transportation, agriculture, banking, telecommunications, and construction. The Cuban State has emphasized agro-industrial coordination and the development of agri-food production to meet the demands of the sector (including those of the population).

Cuban tourism is committed to becoming the driving force behind the nation's development, as one of the most dynamic sectors with the greatest impact on the Cuban economy.

Antigua & Barbuda tourism industry – where land & sea makes beauty




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Antigua & Barbuda have a combined area of 170 sq. miles, making it the largest country within the Leeward Islands sub region. The destination pivots like a keystone in the Caribbean chain; making it an ideal hub for airlines and yachtsmen, which also earned the destination the title as being 'The Heart of the Caribbean'.

2 Islands | 2 Unique Experiences

Bounded by the Caribbean Sea, and Atlantic Ocean; Antigua's 108 sq. miles of landmass presents 95 miles of spectacular coastline, brimmed with glistening bays and sheltered coves. A population of over 90,000 certainly makes Antigua the more bustling of the 2 islands, with an array of activities, sites, restaurants, and hotels to choose from. The undulating landscape presents a wonderful opportunity to take on many different hiking trails - with popular choices such as; Mount Obama, Wallings Dam, Shirley Heights and Monks Hill. Barbuda's 62 sq. miles are encircled by reefs, which 1600s. It's very sparse population has positioned the



island as the perfect get away for those in seek of complete solitude. Labeled as an eco paradise, the rich flora and fauna along with the abundance of land, give rise to the proliferation of the majestic Frigate Bird colony. The islands are best known for their 365 fine white and pink sandy beaches, friendly people and tropical year-round sunshine.

Weddings and Honeymoon

The picturesque twin-islands are known to host a record number of marriages based on their per capita and are on record as hosting 1200 destination weddings in a year. The country is a popular weddings, honeymoon and romance destination.

Sailing

Antigua & Barbuda's geographic attributes lend to a spectacular coastline and steady trade winds, making it world-renowned for its yachting and sailing. In fact, the destination is branded as the sailing capital of the Caribbean, as it boasts the Caribbean's oldest and most prestigious yachting regatta – Antigua Sailing Week. The strong presence of the sailing community can be visibly seen between the months of December to April.

Cruise Tourism

The Cruise Industry within Antigua & Barbuda has received a rejuvenated focus, as Government has made it a key part of its destination strategy to position Antigua and Barbuda as the marquee destination within the Eastern Caribbean for cruise visitors across all cruise-line partners. This is to be achieved by continuing the efforts to improve and diversify the islands' tourism product to enhance the visitor experience on island and to ensure the cruise lines increase their calls to the destination.



Half Moon Bay

Antigua & Barbuda has always been a leader in the tourism industry, being one of the first nations within the Caribbean to make Tourism a key economic pillar. This industry represents the main source of employment for the twin islands at roughly 53% of the workforce.

Beaches and Islands

Many of Antigua's famed beaches rest inside the calm, protected waters on the Caribbean Sea. All of the island's beaches are open to the public.

Northwest Coast: The island's developed northwest coast is home to the popular Dickenson Bay and Runaway Bay, which provide a fully-loaded resort beach experience.

Southwest and South Coast: Winding along the coast are Ffryes Bay, Darkwood Beach and Johnson's Point. Rendezvous Bay and especially Doigs Beach, both located on the central southern coast, are especially quiet beaches as they are only accessible by four-wheel drive or footpaths.

East Coast: Half Moon Bay, voted one of the world's ultimate beaches -- and now a National Park -- is always a great choice. Long Bay, on the easternmost point of the island, is another good choice for families as it is completely protected by its reef.

Beaches of Barbuda: The best-kept secret of the Caribbean is the smooth coastline edged with alternating pink and white sand beaches protected

by barrier reefs on the island of Barbuda. Nearly deserted beaches combine with an environment rich in marine life offering those who venture over to enjoy excellent diving, snorkeling, fishing, bird watching, and of course, an escape from the everyday.

Main Off-Shore Islands: These include, Redonda, Great Bird Island and Green Island, Guiana Island, Prickly Pear Island, Crump Island, Maiden Island, Rabbit Island, York Island, Hells Gate, Sandy Island, and Long Island (which houses the ultra exclusive Jumby Bay Resort and Vacation homes)



Eco-Tourism

Antigua and Barbuda have adopted a strategy that establishes a clear vision, short-medium-long term

objectives and an action agenda to ensure that Antigua and Barbuda have a completely sustainable tourism programme and that Barbuda remains the 'greenest' island in the region.

Barbuda is already one of the most environmentally health islands in the region and is being developed as a totally "green" island.

In Antigua, the island's south-western quadrant has been declared a Green Corridor. The Ministry of Tourism is creating programmes and policies to ensure the sustainable development of tourism projects in Antigua and Barbuda.


Discovering the tourist diversity of **Bolivia**



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Bolivia is a dreamland located in the heart of South America. The life of the planet is gathered in its biodiversity of flora and fauna, the folklore of its people, music, clothing, customs and its varied gastronomy in each of its nine departments.

It is a biogeographic mosaic with regions intertwining with each other. It has natural conservation corridors, such as the mystical Lake Titicaca, its snowy peaks such as the Eastern and Western Cordillera exceeding 6,000 meters high, where you can find large snow-capped peaks such as the majestic *Illampu*, *Huayna Potosi* and the magnificent *Illimani*. In addition, volcanoes, geysers, great salt flats or white deserts, colorful lagoons, *Cochabamba* and



inter-Andean valleys, apart from jungles, swamps, natural parks, and pre-Hispanic hills as part of the Bolivian Amazon.

The Vice-Ministry for Tourism promotes more tourist destinations

Emerging tourism destinations are a new tourism offer in a stage of important development for the different market niches and current trends.

Torotoro: is a town located in the north of Potosi, home to Torotoro National Park, one of the 22 protected areas of national interest.

It is the first sustainable and biosafety tourism destination in Bolivia. It is accessible through a 138 km road from Cochabamba Department and it takes about 4 hours.

Manuripi Amazonian Wildlife National Reserve: you can find Lake Bay at 111 kilometers from Cobija – Pando Departments.

It is a natural paradise nourished by the waters of *Manuripi* River with a high biodiversity of flora and fauna, including a variety of monkeys, tigers, snakes, caimans, tapirs, deer, birds, Amazonian fish, among others. It is an ideal place for nature tourism and stunning sunsets.

Guayaramerin, Cachuela Esperanza: is located in Beni department on the border with Brazil, along the banks of the Mamoré River by the Amazon basin. At 44 kilometers from *Guayaramerín is Cachuela Esperanza*, a region where the rubber boom took place. It was declared a National Historic Monument. It preserves its traditions as reflected in its cultural and artistic festivities, craft fairs, typical food and popular games of the region.

El Chaco: all the tourist potential of this place focuses on three main aspects: nature, culture and history. For those who wish to enjoy nature and gastronomy based on fishing, they can go to the majestic Pilcomayo River, a 50 kilometers route with stories, a life experience with the *Weenhayek* culture and stunning landscapes with waterfalls, pools and cliffs, plus a wonderful variety of flora and fauna.

Wiñay Marca, Huatajata: On the plateau of the Bolivian altiplano almost reaching the sky at 3810 m.a.s.l., you will find Lake *Titicaca* and on its shores *Huatajata*, surrounded by an extraordinary natural and cultural beauty; a very welcoming place with traditions and customs that invite

visitors to live a unique experience during their stay. You can take a boat ride, go hiking, take pictures, enjoy a close-up view of the lake's bird life and, best of all, taste a delicious trout dish.

Incallajta: The archaeological site dates back to the Inca period and is one of the most important archaeological and tourist sites in Bolivia. It is located in the municipality of Pocona in Cochabamba Department and it was built around a large central square or court which is a typical architectural complex of the Inca planning with an outstanding Main Temple or *Kallanka*.

Jardín de las Delicias: it is located in the municipality of *El Torno* in Santa Cruz Department at the southwest zone of the *Amboró* National

Park and Integrated Management Natural Area. It has crystal clear waters, golden sand beaches, waterfalls up to 90 meters high and an endless variety of plants and animals are part of the attraction of this garden.


Tarabuco: it is the capital of the *Yamparáez* Province in *Chuquisaca* Department. It is known as the home of the Yampara culture, famous for its traditional weavings and the typical dance of *Pujllay*.

St. Vincent and The Grenadines the Caribbean you're looking for



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St. Vincent and the Grenadines commonly known as SVG consists of 32 islands and cays. Only 9 of these islands are inhabited; a characteristic adds to SVG's allure as a destination to be eagerly explored. The other islands collectively known as the Grenadines form an archipelago that stretches south of St. Vincent as far as 45 miles.

Mainland St Vincent is a luxuriantly vegetated volcanic island dominated by the fabled La Soufrière Volcano. St Vincent's rugged preternatural beauty with its volcanic peaks, rainforests, waterfalls and rivers beckons like those days of swashbuckling pirates and marauding treasure seekers. It is no wonder then that Disney chose St Vincent as the set for its blockbuster movie *Pirates of the Caribbean: Curse of the Black Pearl*.

St. Vincent is an ecotourism hub with hiking trails, waterfall excursions and even a hot spring river bed deep into the rainforest if you are that adventurous. There is good diving too with St Vincent also known as the Critter Capital of the Caribbean. SVG's lone international airport (Argyle International Airport) is located on St. Vincent but there are 4 smaller airports on the Grenadine islands of Bequia, Mustique, Union Island and Canouan.

The islands and cays that make up the Grenadine archipelago are crested with white, sandy beaches that are a brilliant contrast to the black volcanic beaches on St Vincent. These Grenadine beaches are drenched in turquoise waters reputed among sailors as the best sailing waters in the Caribbean. There are many quiet bays and coves for sailors to elope to or bustling harbours like Port Elizabeth and Clifton. There is always some island within sight along the sparkling waterways of the Grenadine. This island offers routes to romantic getaways whether for dream

weddings or honeymoons or typical beach bumming, sun-imbibing holidays. The accommodation on these islands varies from secluded luxury resorts to boutique hotels to charming guest houses and apartments.



SVG's carnival is called Vincy Mas. It is the destination's leading festival and takes place in June-July. Carnival was brought to SVG by the French settlers but it has been nuanced by the nous and zest of Vincentians. Vincy Mas is a spectacle of music (soca, calypso and steel pan), colour (masquerade) and movement (Dance and parades) and it runs for 12 days to ensure that revellers engage every atom of pleasur

Nine mornings

Nine mornings is a Christmas festival indigenous to St Vincent and the Grenadines. On each of the 9 mornings before Christmas day, Vincentians gather in village squares from about 4:00 am to sing, dance and engage in impromptu acts like comedy sketches and hilarious contests that are subjected to the wit of a whimsical host.

Nine Mornings was started by the enslaved Africans who accompanied their white masters to early morning Christmas mass. They were not allowed inside the church so while they waited on their masters outside they found creative ways to amuse themselves. This was used to build fraternity among one another and to spread the cheer of Christmas.

Nine Mornings celebrations also include early morning sea baths complete with a picnic basket of ginger beer, sorrel juice, homemade bread, black cake and slices of smoked pig leg.

Nine Nights

Nine Nights is a spinoff from Nine Mornings. For each of the nine mornings leading up to Christmas the St Vincent Botanical Garden comes alive with caroling, christmas calypso, storytelling and other cultural acts like a steel pan orchestra in a serenade that is perfect for families. The St Vincent Botanical Garden is one of the oldest botanical gardens in the western hemisphere and when it is lit for Nine Nights celebration it is even more enchanting.

Indigenous Cuisine

Your taste buds can interact with the country's history through its indigenous cuisine. The **Kalinago** and **Garifuna** are SVG's most notable indigenous groups and their descendants are still present today. These indigenous groups have a delectable, cultural share in the country's gastronomy. Cassava bread (bam bam), Farine, a cassava cereal, Madungo bakes made from arrowroot starch, Dakuna and Toumalay sauce are among the indigenous delights of local cuisine. An optimal time to sample these is on March 14th, National Heroes Day, at the Garifuna and Kalinago Cultural Exhibition at Greiggs and Fancy



Grenada, Carriacou & Petite Martinique: The Spice of the Caribbean

Grenade

Discover a destination, so picturesque and pure, where un-spoiled, natural beauty accentuates the friendly smiles of a people content with the simpler things in life. It's a place where turquoise waters kiss pristine white and black sand beaches; and a quick drive inland reveals a plethora of waterfalls, hot springs, and playful Mona Monkeys nestled in a tropical rainforest. This is Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique – the spice of the Caribbean, where the people take care of their natural environment and enjoy sharing unique cultural practices, delightful food and amazing community experiences.

Located in the Southern Caribbean, Southwest of Barbados, and outside the hurricane belt, these beautiful sister islands offer a safe and friendly year-round tropical escape.

With a riveting history, Grenada retains a colonial charm that's not only evident in the vibrant culture and traditions of its people, but in the eighteenth-century Georgian architecture that still defines its capital city, St. George's.



Internationally, the island is known as the Isle of Spice, an accolade fittingly ascribed from the country's production of the most spice species per square mile – predominantly nutmeg and cinnamon, along with fine organic cocoa and exquisite world-famous chocolate.

Measuring just 133-square miles, with only 120,000 people (2020), Grenada's lush terrain is free of towering structures and other signs of over-commercialization. Instead, its landscapes are populated with laden fruit and spice trees, wild tropical gardens, over 164 species of tropical birds and scenic trails that not only beckon; but captivate discerning travelers who often visit throughout their lifetimes.

In Grenada life is PURE – Peaceful, Unadulterated, Rejuvenating and Easy-going, It is effortless, yet engaging, celebratory, yet relaxed. In Grenada, communities are family oriented, people are friendly by nature and common courtesy is not for gain – it's a way of life!

Carriacou

Just 90 minutes by ferry, or 20 minutes by air from the mainland of Grenada, is the destination's second largest island, Carriacou, which means "Isle of Reefs." Measuring just 13 square miles, with a population of 8,000, this tiny island is known as a dive and snorkeler's paradise. With pristine coral reefs and magical drifts, it also has the distinction of being the largest Grenadine Island.

Carriacou boasts a dynamic culture, steeped in ancestral traditions – all of which reflect the French African and Scottish ancestry of its inhabitants. Even today, African big-drum national dance and European quadrille are common staples at celebrations and festivities.

For centuries, Kayaks, as they are commonly called, have passed down through generations, the boatbuilding traditions of their Scottish forefathers evidenced by large sloop schooners that ply local waters. These boats are the feature of the island's premier Regatta Festival, the longest running in the Caribbean.



The island boasts many historic traditions, such as Saraca, Parang Festival, Maroon & String Band Festival and a Historical Museum featuring interesting details on its iconic Shakespeare Mas.

Petite Martinique

This 586-acre island completes the tri-island destination – situated east, off the northern half of Carriacou. About 900 persons live on the island, most of whom derive their income from boat building and fishing. Petite Martinique, has a strong culture and rich history manifested through its traditions and festivals. The highest point on the island, the Piton (750 feet high), was once the site of the island's maroon feast also known as the 'Sugaring of the Piton.' Signature festivals include the cultural Petite Martinique Heritage Weekend and the Whitsuntide Regatta. Petite Martinique is also blessed with fine beaches on its calmer Western Leeward side. Like Carriacou, the French first settled Petite Martinique, which is evident to this day in the names of the islanders. Petite Martinique is accessible via a scenic 15-minute boat ride from Carriacou.

Culture

With its blend of African and European influences, Grenada's culture is expressed through its food, music, dance and arts. The

islands of Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique are home to some of the most unique cultural events in the Caribbean. The summer Spicemas, with its carnival parades, Calypso music and oil-drenched J'Ouvert celebration, is the country's biggest party each August, while the Carriacou Carnival—a Lenten celebration held the Monday and Tuesday before Ash Wednesday—features masked revelers facing off in a form of Shakespearean rap battle. Carriacou has separate festivals dedicated to traditional parang folk music (December) and African maroon culture (late April-early May), the latter highlighted by string bands and smoked foods.

Named the World's First Culinary Capital

Grenada was recently named the world's first "Culinary Capital" by the World Food Travel Association (WFTA), shining a spotlight on the island's unique culinary culture. In addition to an abundance of spices like nutmeg, turmeric, cinnamon, allspice and ginger, Grenada's rich volcanic soil yields the bountiful harvest of Caribbean fruits and vegetables that feed the island's farm-to-table dining experiences and provide the base for Grenada's national dish; oil down, a rich one-pot meal made with vegetables, ground provisions, savory meats and Grenadian spice.





Where to Stay



ALBA-TCP: an Alliance for Life

"17 years in defense of Latin American and Caribbean peace and integration"

On December 14th, 2021, the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our America – People's Trade Treaty (ALBA-TCP) celebrated its 17th anniversary, joining the capacities and strengths of its member countries. The purpose of this alliance has been to contribute to integral development, social equality, quality of life, independence, self-determination and identity of the peoples.

History, principle and fundamental basis

The foundations of ALBA-TCP are rooted in the Charter of Jamaica (1815), where the Liberator Simón Bolívar declared a doctrine of unity and sovereignty for the nations becoming independent from colonial power.

The fundamental principle and basis guiding ALBA-TCP is the broadest solidarity among the peoples of our America, which, at the same time, is based on the ideas of Bolívar, Martí, San Martín, Sucre, O'Higgins, Petión, Morazán, Sandino, Bishop, Garvey, Tupac Katari, Bartolina Sisa, Chatoyer and other heroes of Latin American and Caribbean independence, according to the Joint Declaration of Commanders Hugo Chávez and Hugo Chávez signed on December 14th, 2004.

This historic and unprecedented Latin American and Caribbean integration platform, focused on the social dimension, having the human being as

its foundation and epicenter, based on solidarity, complementarity, justice and cooperation, is an example that proves that the dream of building the *Patria Grande* of our liberators can be materialized, as did the founders of this Alliance, Commanders Hugo Chávez and Fidel Castro, who together with the contributions of each nation strengthened the integration principles.

Challenges and perspectives

Within the framework of an international context of political and economic uncertainty and global health crisis due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the ALBA-TCP countries have stood together in the struggle for the democratization of the international system, the promotion of respect for independence, sovereignty and self-determination of peoples, the defense of the rights of mother Earth and the strengthening of the principles of solidarity, justice and cooperation.

The Alliance has reaffirmed the principles of the "Proclamation of Latin America and the Caribbean as a Zone of Peace", signed by the Heads of State and Government of the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC) at its Second Summit held in Havana in January 2014. During the 2021, the Alliance complied with the part of the tasks entrusted by the Heads of State and/or Government of the Alliance at the 18th



ALBA-TCP Summit on December 14th, 2020 and at the 19th ALBA-TCP Summit on June 24th, 2021, in its three cross-cutting areas: **Social, Economic and Political**.

- In the **social area**, it was worth noting the fund for economic relief for the countries of the Eastern Caribbean, provided by the Bank of ALBA; the establishment of humanitarian air bridges through CONVIASA airline for the shipment of vaccines, medical personnel, treatments, medical supplies, among others, for different Caribbean countries and the implementation of the communication plan to counteract the media war.

- In the **economic area**, Grenada's entry into the ALBA Bank and the implementation of the road map to strengthen a joint ALBA position in the framework of the Twenty-sixth Conference of the Parties (COP26) of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) held in Glasgow, in November 2021, stood out.

- In the **political area**, the Alliance reaffirmed the commitment to Latin American and Caribbean unity; it rejected the economic, commercial and financial blockade imposed by the United States of

America to some of the member countries; it condemned the hegemonic intentions of the United States of America to interfere in internal affairs and the imposition of unilateral coercive measures contrary to international law and the Charter of the United Nations. Also, it promoted the fight against digital and media colonialism and reiterated the solidarity with the Caribbean.

Even though it is true that many tasks have yet to be done to achieve the Alliance's major purposes, the ALBA-TCP countries are sure of the paths to be taken for Latin America and the Caribbean to become the Patria Grande the peoples of the region dream of.
